Chapter 1: Tawheed (Worship Allah Alone)

This chapter teaches the main purpose of life.

Allah created us to worship Him only.

Allah says:

“And I did not create jinn and humans except to worship Me.”

(Surah Adh-Dhariyat 51:56)

Allah also says:

“We sent to every nation a messenger: Worship Allah and stay away from false gods.”

(Surah An-Nahl 16:36)

Allah commands:

“Worship Allah and do not associate anything with Him.”

(Surah An-Nisa 4:36)

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“The right of Allah upon His servants is that they worship Him alone and do not associate anything with Him.”

(Sahih al-Bukhari, Sahih Muslim)

This means:

- Worship must be only for Allah
- Shirk (worshipping others) destroys worship
- All prophets came with the same message

Chapter 2: The Virtue of Tawheed

This chapter teaches that Tawheed brings safety and forgiveness.

Allah says:

“Those who believe and do not mix their belief with ظلم (shirk) will have safety and they are guided.”

(Surah Al-An’am 6:82)

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Whoever testifies that there is no god worthy of worship except Allah... will enter Paradise.”

(Sahih al-Bukhari)

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم also said:

“Allah has made the Fire forbidden for the one who says La ilaha illa Allah seeking Allah’s

Face.”

(Sahih al-Bukhari, Sahih Muslim)

Allah says in a hadith qudsi:

“O son of Adam, if you come to Me with sins filling the earth but without shirk, I will come to you with forgiveness like it.”

This means:

- Tawheed removes sins
- Tawheed protects from punishment
- Tawheed leads to Jannah



Chapter 3: Whoever Has Pure Tawheed Will Enter Paradise Without Account

This chapter teaches that the best people have pure Tawheed.

Allah says:

“Indeed Ibrahim was a true believer, obedient to Allah, and he was not from the polytheists.”

(Surah An-Nahl 16:120)

Allah also says:

“And those who do not associate anything with their Lord.”

(Surah Al-Mu'minun 23:59)

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Seventy thousand people will enter Paradise without account.”

(Sahih al-Bukhari, Sahih Muslim)

They are the ones who:

- Do not depend on superstitions
- Do not use forbidden practices
- Trust Allah completely

This means:

- Strong Tawheed brings high reward
- True trust in Allah is very important

Chapter 4: Fear of Shirk

This chapter teaches that we must always fear shirk.

Kitab At-Tawheed



Allah says:

“Allah does not forgive that partners are associated with Him, but He forgives what is less than that.”

(Surah An-Nisa 4:48)

Prophet Ibrahim عليه السلام said:

“Keep me and my children away from worshipping idols.”

(Surah Ibrahim 14:35)

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“What I fear most for you is minor shirk (showing off).”

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم also said:

“Whoever dies while associating partners with Allah will enter the Fire.”

(Sahih al-Bukhari)

And:

“Whoever meets Allah without shirk will enter Paradise.”

(Sahih Muslim)

This means:

- Shirk is the biggest sin
- Even small shirk (showing off) is dangerous
- We must always be careful

Chapter 5: Calling to Tawheed

This chapter teaches that we must call people to worship Allah alone.

Allah says:

“Say: This is my way, I call to Allah with knowledge.”

(Surah Yusuf 12:108)

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said to Mu’adh:

“Let the first thing you call them to be that they worship Allah alone.”

(Sahih al-Bukhari, Sahih Muslim)

Then he told him:

- Teach prayer
- Then zakah

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“If Allah guides one person through you, it is better for you than red camels.”

(Sahih al-Bukhari)

This means:

- Start with Tawheed first
- Teach step by step
- Guiding others is a great reward

Chapter 6: Explanation of La ilaha illa Allah

This chapter explains the true meaning of Tawheed.

Allah says:

“They call upon others who themselves seek closeness to Allah.”

(Surah Al-Isra 17:57)

Allah says:

“Ibrahim said: I am free from what you worship except Allah.”

(Surah Az-Zukhruf 43:26–28)

Allah says:

“They took their scholars and monks as lords besides Allah.”

(Surah At-Tawbah 9:31)

Allah says:

“Some people love others like they love Allah.”

(Surah Al-Baqarah 2:165)

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Whoever says La ilaha illa Allah and rejects all that is worshipped besides Allah, his blood and wealth are protected.”

(Sahih Muslim)

This means:

- You must reject all false gods
- Not just say it with your tongue
- Worship must be only for Allah

Chapter 7: Wearing Rings, Strings, etc.

This chapter teaches that using objects for protection is not allowed.

Allah says:

“If Allah touches you with harm, none can remove it except Him.”

(Surah Az-Zumar 39:38)



Kitab At-Tawheed

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Remove it, it will only increase your weakness.”

(Musnad Ahmad)

He also said:

“Whoever wears an amulet has committed shirk.”

This means:

- Objects do not protect you
- Only Allah protects

Chapter 8: Ruqyah, Amulets, and Charms

This chapter teaches that many protection methods people use are not allowed.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Ruqyah, amulets, and love charms are shirk.”

(Musnad Ahmad, Abu Dawud)

But:

- Ruqyah using Qur’an and du’a is allowed

Allah’s words are a cure.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Whoever hangs something will be left to it.”

(Musnad Ahmad, At-Tirmidhi)

This means:

- Do not depend on objects
- Only depend on Allah

Chapter 9: Seeking Blessings from Trees or Stones

This chapter teaches that asking blessings from objects is wrong.

Allah says:

“Have you seen Al-Lat and Al-‘Uzza?”

(Surah An-Najm 53:19–20)

The companions once said:

“Make for us a tree like they have.”

Kitab At-Tawheed

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“You said like the people of Musa said: make for us a god.”

(Sunan At-Tirmidhi)

This means:

- Even small actions can lead to shirk
- Do not copy people of shirk



Chapter 10: Slaughtering for Other Than Allah

This chapter teaches that sacrifice is worship.

It must be only for Allah.

Allah says:

“Say: my prayer and my sacrifice are for Allah.”

(Surah Al-An’am 6:162)

Allah says:

“Pray to your Lord and sacrifice.”

(Surah Al-Kawthar 108:2)

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Allah curses the one who sacrifices for other than Allah.”

(Sahih Muslim)

This means:

- Sacrifice is an act of worship
- It must be only for Allah

Chapter 11: Do Not Worship in Places of Shirk

This chapter teaches that places of shirk must be avoided.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم asked:

“Were idols worshipped there?”

When told no, he allowed the vow.

This means:

- If a place has shirk → avoid it
- Do not worship in such places

Chapter 12: Vows Must Be for Allah

This chapter teaches that vows are worship.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Whoever vows to obey Allah should obey Him.”

(Sahih al-Bukhari)

This means:

- Vows must be for Allah only
- Vowing to others is shirk

Chapter 13: Seeking Protection from Other Than Allah

This chapter teaches that asking protection is worship.

Allah says:

“Men used to seek refuge with jinn, and it increased them in fear.”

(Surah Al-Jinn 72:6)

This means:

- Do not seek protection from jinn or unseen
- Only ask Allah

Chapter 14: Seeking Help from Other Than Allah

This chapter teaches that help belongs to Allah.

Allah says:

“You alone we worship and You alone we ask for help.”

(Surah Al-Fatihah 1:5)

This means:

- Ask Allah first
- Do not depend on others for unseen help

Chapter 15: Created Things Cannot Be Worshipped

This chapter teaches:

- Creation cannot be worshipped

Allah says:

“They worship things that cannot create anything.”

This means:

- Only the Creator deserves worship
-

Chapter 16: Clear Warning Against Shirk

This chapter teaches that Allah clearly forbids shirk.

Allah says:

“Do not set up partners with Allah.”

Shirk is the greatest ظلم.

Chapter 17: Intercession Belongs to Allah

This chapter teaches:

- Intercession is only by Allah’s permission

Allah says:

“Who can intercede except with His permission?”
(Surah Al-Baqarah 2:255)

This means:

- Do not ask others directly
 - Ask Allah only
-

Chapter 18: Allah Guides Whom He Wills

This chapter teaches:

- Guidance is from Allah

Allah says:

“You cannot guide whom you love, but Allah guides whom He wills.”
(Surah Al-Qasas 28:56)

This means:

- We call people



Kitab At-Tawheed

- Allah guides them



Chapter 19: Exaggeration Leads to Shirk

This chapter teaches:

- Going too far in praising people leads to shirk

This happened in past nations.

This means:

- Respect people
- Do not worship them

Chapter 20: Worship at Graves

This chapter teaches:

- Turning graves into worship places is wrong

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Do not take graves as places of worship.”

This means:

- Do not pray at graves
- Do not worship there

Good. Continuing the same way:

- Easy English
- Short paragraphs
- Clear proofs (Surah + ayah / hadith)
- No important points left out

Chapter 21: Building Over Graves Leads to Shirk

This chapter teaches that building on graves can lead to worshipping them.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“May Allah curse the Jews and Christians, they took the graves of their prophets as places of worship.”

(Sahih al-Bukhari, Sahih Muslim)

This means:

- Do not build over graves
- Do not make them special places
- This leads to shirk

Chapter 22: The Prophet Protected Tawheed

This chapter teaches that the Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم blocked every path that leads to shirk.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Do not praise me too much like the Christians praised ‘Isa (Jesus). I am only a servant, so say: the servant of Allah and His Messenger.”

(Sahih al-Bukhari)

This means:

- Do not exaggerate the Prophet
- Keep Tawheed pure

Chapter 23: Some of This Ummah Will Worship Idols

This chapter teaches that shirk will happen again.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“The Hour will not come until some people from my Ummah worship idols.”

(Sahih al-Bukhari)

This means:

- Muslims must be careful
 - Shirk can return
-

Chapter 24: Magic (Sihir)

This chapter teaches that magic is disbelief.

Allah says:

“But they learned what harms them and does not benefit them.”

(Surah Al-Baqarah 2:102)

This means:

- Magic is harmful
 - It is forbidden and leads to disbelief
-

Chapter 25: Types of Magic

This chapter explains that magic has many types.

All types:

- Are harmful
- Lead to corruption

This means:

- Stay away from all forms of magic
-

Chapter 26: Fortune Tellers and Soothsayers

This chapter teaches that going to fortune tellers is forbidden.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Whoever goes to a fortune teller and believes him has disbelieved.”

(Musnad Ahmad)

This means:

- Only Allah knows the unseen
 - Do not believe such people
-

Chapter 27: Removing Magic with Magic

This chapter teaches that using magic to remove magic is not allowed.



Kitab At-Tawheed

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم was asked about this and he said:
“It is from the work of Shaytan.”

This means:

- Use Qur’an and du’a only
- Not magic



Chapter 28: Bad Omens

This chapter teaches that believing in bad luck is shirk.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:
“Bad omens are shirk.”
(Musnad Ahmad)

This means:

- Do not believe in luck signs
- Trust Allah only

Chapter 29: Astrology

This chapter teaches that using stars for knowledge of the future is wrong.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:
“Whoever learns astrology learns a branch of magic.”
(Abu Dawud)

This means:

- Stars do not control your life
- Allah controls everything

Chapter 30: Seeking Rain from Stars

This chapter teaches that rain comes only from Allah.

Allah says:
“And you make your provision that you deny (by saying it comes from stars).”
(Surah Al-Waqi’ah 56:82)

Kitab At-Tawheed

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Whoever says rain came from stars has disbelieved in Me.”

(Sahih al-Bukhari, Sahih Muslim)

This means:

- Do not connect rain to stars
 - All blessings come from Allah
-



Chapter 31: Loving Allah

This chapter teaches that love is worship.

Allah says:

“Those who believe love Allah more.”

(Surah Al-Baqarah 2:165)

This means:

- Love Allah the most
 - Do not love anything like Allah
-

Chapter 32: Fear of Allah Alone

This chapter teaches that fear is worship.

Allah says:

“So do not fear them, but fear Me.”

(Surah Al-Baqarah 2:150)

This means:

- Fear Allah more than people
 - Fear keeps you away from sin
-

Chapter 33: Trust in Allah

This chapter teaches that trust (tawakkul) is worship.

Allah says:

“And put your trust in Allah if you are believers.”

(Surah Al-Ma'idah 5:23)

This means:

- Do your effort
- Depend on Allah



Chapter 34: Do Not Feel Safe from Allah's Plan

This chapter teaches that feeling completely safe is wrong.

Allah says:

“No one feels safe from the plan of Allah except the losers.”

(Surah Al-A'raf 7:99)

This means:

- Do not feel guaranteed
- Always fear Allah's punishment

Chapter 35: Be Patient with Allah's Decree

This chapter teaches patience.

Allah says:

“And be patient with what Allah has decreed.”

This means:

- Accept what happens
- Be patient with hardship

Chapter 36: Showing Off (Riya)

This chapter teaches that showing off is shirk.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“The thing I fear most for you is minor shirk: showing off.”

(Musnad Ahmad)

This means:

- Do actions for Allah only
- Not for people

Kitab At-Tawheed

Chapter 37: Doing Deeds for Dunya

This chapter teaches that doing good only for dunya is wrong.

Allah says:

“Whoever wants the life of this world, We give him from it, but in the Hereafter he has no share.”

(Surah Hud 11:15–16)

This means:

- Do deeds for Allah
 - Not for fame or money
-

Chapter 38: Taking Scholars and Leaders as Lords

This chapter teaches that obeying people in haram is shirk.

Allah says:

“They took their scholars and monks as lords besides Allah.”

(Surah At-Tawbah 9:31)

This means:

- Follow scholars only in truth
 - Do not obey them in disobedience
-

Chapter 39: Judging by Other Than Allah’s Law

This chapter teaches that laws must be from Allah.

Allah says:

“Whoever does not judge by what Allah has revealed, they are disbelievers.”

(Surah Al-Ma’idah 5:44)

This means:

- Islam must be followed
 - Not man-made laws over Allah’s law
-

Chapter 40: Denying Allah's Names and Attributes

This chapter teaches that we must believe in Allah's names.

Allah says:

“To Allah belong the best names.”

(Surah Al-A'raf 7:180)

This means:

- Accept Allah's names
 - Do not deny or change them
-

Chapter 41: Denying Allah's Blessings

This chapter teaches that some people know Allah's blessings but deny them.

Allah says:

“They recognize the favor of Allah, then they deny it.”

(Surah An-Nahl 16:83)

This means:

- Everything you have is from Allah
 - You must thank Him
 - Do not say it is only from yourself
-

Chapter 42: Do Not Set Rivals with Allah

This chapter teaches that nothing should be equal to Allah.

Allah says:

“So do not set up rivals to Allah while you know.”

(Surah Al-Baqarah 2:22)

This means:

- No partners with Allah
 - No equal to Allah
-

Chapter 43: Being Unsatisfied with Oath by Allah

Kitab At-Tawheed

This chapter teaches respect for Allah's name.

If someone swears by Allah, you should accept it.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Whoever swears by Allah, let him speak the truth. And whoever is asked by Allah, let him be satisfied.”

(Sunan Ibn Majah)

This means:

- Respect Allah's name
 - Do not reject it
-

Chapter 44: Saying “What Allah and You Will”

This chapter teaches correct speech.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Do not say: what Allah and so-and-so will. But say: what Allah wills, then what so-and-so wills.”

(Abu Dawud)

This means:

- Allah comes first
 - Do not make people equal to Allah
-

Chapter 45: Cursing Time

This chapter teaches that time should not be cursed.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Do not curse time, for Allah is the controller of time.”

(Sahih Muslim)

This means:

- Allah controls everything
 - Do not complain about time
-

Chapter 46: Names Like “Judge of Judges”

This chapter teaches that some names belong only to Allah.



Kitab At-Tawheed

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“The worst name with Allah is the one called ‘King of Kings.’”

(Sahih al-Bukhari, Sahih Muslim)

This means:

- Do not use names that belong only to Allah



Chapter 47: Respecting Allah’s Names

This chapter teaches that Allah’s names must be respected.

Allah says:

“To Allah belong the best names, so call Him by them.”

(Surah Al-A’raf 7:180)

This means:

- Use Allah’s names properly
- Do not misuse them

Chapter 48: Mocking the Religion

This chapter teaches that making fun of Islam is disbelief.

Allah says:

“Was it Allah, His verses, and His Messenger that you were mocking? Do not make excuses—you have disbelieved.”

(Surah At-Tawbah 9:65–66)

This means:

- Never joke about religion
- It is very serious

Chapter 49: Saying “I Got This by Myself”

This chapter teaches that success is from Allah.

Allah says:

“This has been given to me because of my knowledge.”

(Surah Az-Zumar 39:49)

This is wrong.

Kitab At-Tawheed

This means:

- Always thank Allah
 - Do not think you did it alone
-



Chapter 50: Names Showing Servitude to Other Than Allah

This chapter teaches that names must show servitude to Allah only.

This means:

- Do not use names that show worship to others
 - Servitude is only for Allah
-

Chapter 51: Allah Has the Most Beautiful Names

This chapter teaches that Allah's names are perfect.

Allah says:

“To Allah belong the best names, so call Him by them.”

(Surah Al-A'raf 7:180)

This means:

- Allah's names are complete and perfect
 - We use them when making du'a
-

Chapter 52: Do Not Say “As-Salam Upon Allah”

This chapter teaches proper respect.

The companions used to say this, but the Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم corrected them.

He said:

“Allah is As-Salam (The Source of Peace).”

(Sahih al-Bukhari, Sahih Muslim)

This means:

- Allah gives peace
 - We do not say peace upon Him
-

Chapter 53: Saying “O Allah Forgive Me If You Want”

This chapter teaches how to make du‘a correctly.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Do not say: O Allah forgive me if You want. Be firm in asking.”

(Sahih al-Bukhari, Sahih Muslim)

This means:

- Ask with certainty
 - Do not speak with doubt
-

Chapter 54: Do Not Say “My Slave”

This chapter teaches respectful speech.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Do not say: my slave... but say: my boy or my girl.”

(Sahih al-Bukhari, Sahih Muslim)

This means:

- Use respectful words
 - Avoid wrong expressions
-

Chapter 55: Respond to One Who Asks by Allah

This chapter teaches respect for Allah’s name.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Whoever asks you by Allah, give him.”

(Abu Dawud)

This means:

- If someone asks using Allah’s name, respect it
-

Chapter 56: Ask Allah for Paradise

This chapter teaches what to ask from Allah.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“When you ask Allah, ask Him for Paradise.”

(Sunan At-Tirmidhi)



Kitab At-Tawheed

This means:

- Ask for the best reward
- Aim for Jannah



Chapter 57: Saying “If Only...”

This chapter teaches how to speak about the past.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Do not say: if only I did this... it opens the door of Shaytan.”
(Sahih Muslim)

This means:

- Do not regret in a wrong way
- Accept Allah’s decree

Chapter 58: Do Not Curse the Wind

This chapter teaches respect for Allah’s creation.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Do not curse the wind.”
(Sunan At-Tirmidhi)

This means:

- The wind follows Allah’s command
- Do not insult it

Chapter 59: Thinking Bad About Allah

This chapter teaches having good thoughts about Allah.

Allah says:

“They thought badly about Allah.”
(Surah Al-Fath 48:6)

This means:

- Always think good about Allah
- Trust His wisdom

Chapter 60: Denying Qadr (Destiny)

This chapter teaches belief in destiny.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“Everything happens by Allah’s decree.”

(Sahih Muslim)

This means:

- Allah controls everything
- Good and bad are by His decree

Chapter 61: Punishment for Making Images

This chapter teaches that making images of living things is forbidden.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم said:

“The most severely punished people are image-makers.”

(Sahih al-Bukhari, Sahih Muslim)

This means:

- Do not make images of living beings

Chapter 62: Too Many Oaths

This chapter teaches not to swear too much.

Allah says:

“And do not obey every worthless habitual swearer.”

(Surah Al-Qalam 68:10)

This means:

- Do not swear often
- Respect Allah’s name

Chapter 63: Protecting Allah’s Covenant

This chapter teaches fulfilling promises.

Kitab At-Tawheed

Allah says:

“Fulfill the covenant of Allah.”

This means:

- Keep promises made in Allah’s name
-



Chapter 64: Swearing Upon Allah

This chapter teaches that no one should swear using Allah in a wrong way.

This means:

- Do not speak about Allah without knowledge
-

Chapter 65: Do Not Ask Allah to Intercede to Creation

This chapter teaches respect.

This means:

- Allah is above His creation
 - Do not lower His status
-

Chapter 66: The Prophet Protected Tawheed

This chapter teaches again:

- The Prophet صلى الله عليه وسلم protected Tawheed in every way

This means:

- He blocked all paths to shirk
-

Chapter 67: Not Giving Allah His True Right

This chapter teaches that people do not understand Allah properly.

Allah says:

“They did not give Allah His true worth.”

(Surah Az-Zumar 39:67)

This means:

- Allah is عظيم (great)

- We must respect Him properly
