

أبو هريرة - رضي الله عنه . 1

كَانَ كُلَّمَا خَرَجَ مِنْ بَيْتِهِ، يَقِفُ عِنْدَ بَابِ أُمِّهِ وَيَقُولُ
السَّلَامُ عَلَيْكَ يَا أُمِّي، رَحِمَكَ اللَّهُ كَمَا رَبَّيْتَنِي صَغِيرًا
فَتَقُولُ لَهُ: وَرَحِمَكَ اللَّهُ كَمَا بَرَرْتَنِي كَبِيرًا

Every time he left his house, he would stand at his mother's door and say, "Peace be upon you, my mother. May Allah have mercy on you as you raised me when I was young." She would reply, "And may Allah have mercy on you as you were dutiful to me when you grew up."

حَارِثَةُ بِنُ التُّعْمَانِ - رضي الله عنه . 2

كَانَ يُسَاعِدُ أُمَّهُ كُلَّ يَوْمٍ، وَيُمَشِّطُ شَعْرَهَا بِيَدِهِ، وَيُطْعِمُهَا
لَمْ يَقُلْ لَهَا كَلِمَةً سَيِّئَةً قطُّ

He helped his mother every day, combed her hair with his own hands and fed her gently. He never spoke a single harsh word to her.

زَيْنُ الْعَابِدِينَ عَلِيُّ بْنُ الْحُسَيْنِ . 3

كَانَ لَا يَأْكُلُ مَعَ أُمِّهِ فِي صَحْفَةٍ وَاحِدَةٍ خَوْفًا أَنْ تَسْبِقَ يَدُهُ إِلَى مَا تُرِيدُهُ

He never ate from the same plate as his mother, fearing that his hand might reach for what she wanted first.

4. عبد الله بن عمر – رضي الله عنه

رَأَى رَجُلًا يَطُوفُ بِالْكَعْبَةِ وَيَحْمِلُ أُمَّهُ عَلَى ظَهْرِهِ، فَقَالَ: «أَتَرَانِي جَزَيْتُهَا؟» فَقَالَ ابْنُ عُمَرَ: لَا، وَلَا بِزُفْرَةٍ وَاحِدَةٍ

He saw a man performing tawaf around the Ka'bah carrying his mother on his back. The man asked, "Have I repaid her?" Ibn 'Umar replied, "No, not even for a single contraction she suffered when giving birth to you."

5. حارثة بن النعمان

كَانَ يُطْعِمُ أُمَّهُ بِيَدِهِ، وَيُجْلِسُهَا مَكَانَهُ، وَيُكَلِّمُهَا بِأَدَبٍ

He fed his mother with his own hand, gave her his seat and spoke to her with great respect.

6. سعيد بن المسيب

قَالَ: مَا نَظَرْتُ إِلَى أُمِّي حَمْسِينَ سَنَةً حَيَاءً مِنْهَا

He said, "I did not look directly at my mother for fifty years out of respect for her."

7. طلحة بن مصرف

قَالَ: إِذَا كَلَّمْتُ أُمَّي، حَفَضْتُ صَوْتِي، وَمَا سَمِعْتَنِي أَقُولُ لَهَا أُفٍّ

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He said, “When I speak to my mother, I lower my voice and she has never heard me say even ‘uff’ to her.”



8. محمد بن سيرين

كَانَ يَتَكَلَّمُ مَعَ أُمِّهِ كَأَنَّهُ عَبْدٌ ذَلِيلٌ أَمَامَ مَوْلَاهُ

He spoke to his mother with such humility as if he were a humble servant before his master.

9. ابن الجوزي

كَانَ يَغْسِلُ قَدَمِي أُمِّهِ كُلَّ لَيْلَةٍ وَيَدْعُو لَهَا

He washed his mother’s feet every night and prayed for her.

10. سفيان الثوري

قَالَ: النَّظَرُ إِلَى الْوَالِدَيْنِ عِبَادَةٌ

He said, “Looking at one’s parents with love is an act of worship.”

11. أبو يوسف تلميذ أبي حنيفة

كَانَ يُقْبِلُ رَأْسَ أُمِّهِ قَبْلَ كُلِّ دَرْسٍ

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He kissed his mother's head before every lesson.



12. الإمام أحمد بن حنبل.

كَانَ يُطْعِمُ أُمَّهُ بِيَدِهِ، وَيَقُولُ: دَعْوَتُهَا سَهْمٌ لَا يُخْطِئُ

He fed his mother with his own hand and said, "Her supplication is an arrow that never misses."

13. الإمام الشافعي.

قَالَ: مَا نَمْتُ لَيْلَةً حَتَّى أَدْعُو لِأُمِّي وَأَبِي

He said, "I never sleep at night without praying for my mother and father."

14. أبو حازم سلمة بن دينار.

قَالَ: مَنْ نَظَرَ إِلَى وَالِدَيْهِ نَظَرَ غَضَبٍ فَهُوَ عَاقٌ وَلَوْ لَمْ يَقُلْ شَيْئًا

He said, "Whoever looks at his parents with anger is disobedient, even if he says nothing."

15. عمر بن عبد العزيز.

كَانَ يُرَاسِلُ أُمَّهُ بِرِسَائِلِ الْمَحَبَّةِ، وَيَقُولُ: لَا أَسْتَعْنِي عَنْ دُعَائِكَ

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He used to write loving letters to his mother, saying, “I can never live or be without your supplications.”



16. بكر بن عبد الله المزني

كَانَ إِذَا ذَكَرَ أُمَّهُ بَكَى، وَقَالَ: أَحَافُ أَنْ أَقْصِرَ فِي حَقِّهَا

He would cry whenever he mentioned his mother and say, “I fear that I have fallen short in her rights.”

17. يحيى بن معين

كَانَ يَمْنَعُ نَفْسَهُ مِنَ السَّفَرِ الطَّوِيلِ خَوْفًا أَنْ تَحْزَنَ أُمُّهُ

He avoided long journeys so his mother would not feel sad.

18. أُسَامَةُ بْنُ زَيْدٍ (رَضِيَ اللَّهُ عَنْهُمَا)

قِيلَ لَهُ: لِمَ قَطَعْتَ النَّخْلَةَ؟ فَقَالَ: إِنَّ أُمَّيْ اشْتَهَتْهُ عَلَيَّ، وَلَيْسَ شَيْءٌ مِنَ الدُّنْيَا تَطْلُبُهُ أُمَّيْ أَقْدِرُ عَلَيْهِ إِلَّا فَعَلْتُهُ

When asked why he cut down a palm tree, he replied, “My mother desired it and anything in this world that she asks for, if I am able to do it: I will.”

19. مسعر بن كدام

اسْتَسْنَقْتُ أُمَّ مِسْعَرَ مِنْهُ مَاءً فِي اللَّيْلِ، فَقَامَ فَجَاءَهَا بِهِ وَقَدْ نَامَتْ، فَكَّرَهُ أَنْ يُوقِظَهَا، فَبَقِيَ قَائِمًا وَالْإِنَاءُ فِي يَدِهِ حَتَّى أَصْبَحَ

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His mother once asked him for water at night. When he brought it, she had fallen asleep. He disliked waking her, so he stood holding the cup until morning.



20. سَعِيدُ بْنُ السُّفْيَانِ التَّوْرِيُّ.

قَالَ: مَا جَفَوْتُ أَبِي قَطُّ، وَإِنَّهُ لَيَدْعُونِي وَأَنَا فِي الصَّلَاةِ غَيْرِ الْمَكْتُوبَةِ، فَأَقْطَعُهَا لَهُ

He said, “I never showed disrespect to my father. When he called me while I was praying a non-obligatory prayer, I stopped it to answer him.”

21. الْفَضْلُ بْنُ يَحْيَى الْبَرْمَكِيُّ.

كَانَ يَحْيَى لَا يَتَوَضَّأُ إِلَّا بِمَاءٍ سَاخِنٍ، فَلَمَّا مُنِعُوا الْحَطَبَ، قَامَ الْفَضْلُ بِالْقِمَمِ فَسَخَّنَهُ بِنَارِ الْمِصْبَاحِ حَتَّى أَصْبَحَ

His father used to make wudu' only with warm water. When they were imprisoned and had no firewood, Al-Fadl warmed water by holding a pot over a lamp all night.

22. حَيَّوَةُ بْنُ شَرِيحٍ.

كَانَ حَيَّوَةُ يُعَلِّمُ النَّاسَ، فَتَقُولُ أُمُّهُ: يَا حَيَّوَةُ! أَلْقِ الشَّعِيرَ لِلدَّجَاجِ، فَيَقُومُ وَيَتْرُكُ التَّعْلِيمَ

While teaching his students, his mother called him saying, “Haywah, feed the chickens!” He immediately left his teaching to obey her.

22. فَضَالَةُ بْنُ عُبَيْدٍ - رَضِيَ اللَّهُ عَنْهُ.

كَانَ لَا يَرْفَعُ صَوْتَهُ فِي بَيْتِ أُمِّهِ تَعْظِيمًا لَهَا

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He never raised his voice in his mother's house out of respect.



23. إِبْرَاهِيمُ بْنُ آدَمَ - رَحِمَهُ اللهُ.

كَانَ يَغْسِلُ ثِيَابَ أُمِّهِ بِيَدِهِ وَيَقُولُ: هَذَا شَرَفٌ لِي

He washed his mother's clothes himself, saying, "This is an honor for me."

24. الْجُنَيْدُ بْنُ مُحَمَّدٍ - رَحِمَهُ اللهُ.

قَالَ: مَنْ خَدَمَ وَالِدَيْهِ فِي صِغَرِهِ، خَدَمَهُ أَوْلَادُهُ فِي كِبَرِهِ

"Whoever serves his parents in youth will be served by his children in old age."

25. عَامِرُ بْنُ عَبْدِ قَيْسٍ - رَحِمَهُ اللهُ.

كَانَ يَسْمَعُ صَوْتَ أُمِّهِ وَهِيَ تَدْعُوهُ، فَيَقُولُ: لَبَّيْكَ يَا أُمَّي، لَبَّيْكَ

Whenever he heard his mother calling, he would answer, "Here I am, my mother, here I am."

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عَبْدُ اللَّهِ بْنُ الْمُبَارَكِ - رَحْمَةُ اللَّهِ. 26
كَانَ يُقْبِلُ يَدَ أُمِّهِ بَعْدَ كُلِّ كَلَامٍ مَعَهَا

He kissed his mother's hand after every conversation with her.

سَلْمَانُ الْفَارِسِيُّ - رَضِيَ اللَّهُ عَنْهُ. 27
كَانَ يَزُورُ أُمَّهُ فِي كُلِّ صَبَاحٍ، وَيَسْأَلُهَا عَنِ حَالِهَا

He visited his mother every morning and asked about her well-being.

حَمْدُ بْنُ كَعْبٍ الْفَرَزْدِيُّ - رَحْمَةُ اللَّهِ. 28
قَالَ: بَرُّ الْوَالِدَيْنِ سَبَبٌ لِبَرَكَاتِ الْعُمْرِ وَالرِّزْقِ

“Honoring parents brings blessings in life and provision.”

الرُّهْرِيُّ - رَحْمَةُ اللَّهِ. 29
كَانَ يَجْلِسُ عِنْدَ أُمِّهِ فَتَقُولُ لَهُ كَلِمَةً فَيَقُومُ لَهَا حَتَّى تَفْرَغَ

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He would stand respectfully while his mother spoke until she finished.



30. الفصل بن موسى - رَحْمَةُ اللَّهِ.

كَانَ يَغْسِلُ يَدَيْ أُمِّهِ قَبْلَ الطَّعَامِ وَبَعْدَهُ

He washed his mother's hands before and after meals.

31. العتّابي - رَحْمَةُ اللَّهِ.

قَالَ: مَا نَمْتُ قَطُّ وَأُمِّي غَاضِبَةٌ عَلَيَّ

“I never slept while my mother was upset with me.”
